



**Summary of the Application and Requirements of the
Public Health and Social Measures linked to vaccination status Direction
For Shooting Clubs and Ranges**

This Direction will be in effect from 5am AEST Friday 17 December 2021.

The Direction applies only to a ***business, activity or undertaking*** in Queensland that is listed in **Schedule 1**. Section 10 of the Direction provides that a ***business, activity or undertaking*** that is not listed in Schedule 1 may otherwise operate as normal, subject in some cases to information collection and physical distancing requirements.

For the purposes of shooting clubs and ranges, the terms of Schedule 1 apply as follows:

Outdoor Ranges

Schedule 1 does not include participation in outdoor sporting activity of any kind. Therefore, for shooting ranges that are outdoor ranges, there is no requirement to either:

- Exclude persons who are not vaccinated; or
- To collect information via the *Check In Qld App*.

Pursuant to section 10 of the Directive, clubs and ranges that are outdoor, may operate as normal.

Club Houses

Club houses fall within Schedule 1B as 'Indoor sports centres and venues, indoor social sporting-based activities, community sports clubs'.

The Direction allows both vaccination and unvaccinated persons to enter a club house at a club or range, but:

- Occupation density of the club house is limited to no more than 1 person per 2 square metres.
- Information must be collected from members and visitors via the *Check In Qld App*.

Note also:

- a) In the case of an outdoor range with a club house, the occupant density and information collection requirements apply only to the club house and not to the outdoor range.
- b) If the club house includes a restaurant, café, or bar, then entry to the club house is subject to the following rules:
 - Only those who are fully vaccinated may enter; and
 - The club must collect information about visitors via the *Check In Qld App*

Indoor Ranges

Indoor ranges fall within Schedule 1B as ‘Indoor sports centres and venues, indoor social sporting-based activities, community sports clubs’.

The Direction allows both vaccinated and unvaccinated persons to enter a club house at a club or range, but:

- Occupation density of the club house is limited to no more than 1 person per 2 square metres.
- Information must be collected from members and visitors via the *Check In Qld App*.

Training Activities

Schedule 1B includes “Universities and other higher education institutions such as Technical and Further Education (TAFE) and Registered Training Organisations (RTO)” as a business or activity. Therefore, where a range or club house is being used for training purposes (eg Courses in Firearms Safety), the requirements applicable to RTOs would apply. These are:

- Contact information must be collected by the *Check In Qld App*;
- Occupant density is limited to no more than 1 person per 2 square metres for areas open to or used by visitors in indoor spaces;
- Both vaccinated and unvaccinated persons are permitted to access.
